The students devised the performance, keep reflective journals on their progress and participation and presented their

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work for their peers, family and at the annual West Hawaii ELL Speech Festival.

# **Island Spirit: Community Transformation through Culture**

This partnership of HTY and the University of Hawaii Pacific Outreach Initiatives combined theatre and Micronesian performing arts with community outreach to bring together young people, families, cultural artists and leaders of several Micronesian cultures through the creation and presentation of a culturally specific production.

#### Folklore and Drama in ESL Education

In this combination folklore and drama residency, developed to meet the needs of Hawaii's growing Pacific Island ESL population, the students explore and dramatize a story from their culture. The residency builds on cultural storytelling and oral traditions and exercising students' oral skills, which is the first step in developing reading and writing skills as well.
